Knowledgeable A&P Technicians are becoming: FEWER AND FEWER




The Challenge: Lack of knowledgeable Techs

Without a mechanism in place to continue to drive new mechanics to our warbird community, we will ever more quickly see challenges in keeping our planes airworthy.




